

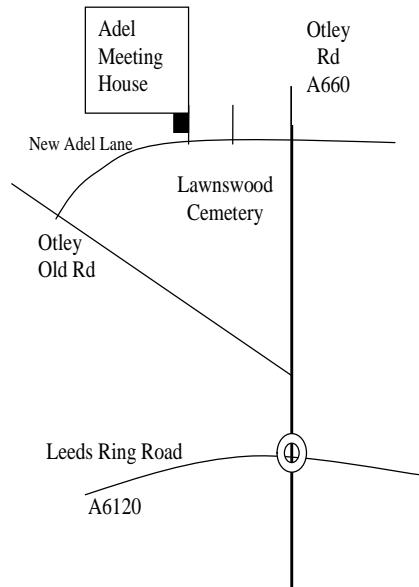

What do Quakers believe?

A Way to God

Quakerism is a way of life rather than a set of beliefs. Quakers seek to experience God directly, within themselves and in their relationships with others and the world around them. These direct encounters with the Divine are where Quakers find meaning and purpose.

Quaker Spiritual Practice

The bedrock of the Quaker way is the silent meeting for worship. We seek a communal gathered stillness where we can be open to inspiration from the Spirit of God. During our meetings for worship some may feel moved to speak: anyone can speak, as all are considered equal.

Quakers, God and Jesus

Every Quaker will have their own interpretation of the word 'God', but in fact we all have a great deal in common and try not to spend too much time on definitions. For example, you will find some Quakers who have a strong belief in Jesus Christ as their saviour, while others recognise that Jesus was a good man whose example is worth following, but aren't too concerned about the theology. All this makes for a rich and diverse company of Quakers.

What will the evening be like?

Quaker Quest is a relaxed and friendly evening course where three Quakers will share their spiritual experiences and journeys.

Quakers are very tolerant of a wide range of points of view and there will be opportunities to explore the topic with others in a supportive way.
